1. Subject to Georgia National Fair General Rules and Regulations and ALSA Handbook 15th Edition.

2. **HEALTH REQUIREMENTS:** Health certificates meeting requirements set forth by Georgia Department of Agriculture are required on all arrivals.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR EXHIBITION OF LIVESTOCK IN GEORGIA

All animals being exhibited in any type of livestock show (local, county, area, district, or state) must have an official certificate of veterinary inspection (health certificate). The health certificate must be issued within 30 days of the exhibition.

V. EXOTIC ANIMALS

A. Llama and alpacas are now exempt from negative brucellosis test requirements. Those entering the Fair must still be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and be identified by a USDA approved metal ear tag, unique and individual tattoo, notarized photograph, or an electronic identification device (microchip). If electronic identification is used the consignee is responsible for providing the appropriate reading device for verification.

B. Individual identification of llamas, alpacas, and camels may be exempted provided the animals are accompanied by the following:

1. A certificate of veterinary inspection with a general description
2. A photograph of each animal being exhibited
3. A notarized letter which verifies the animals being exhibited are those included on the certificate of veterinary inspection and the photographs. An official certificate of veterinary inspection must show proof of the above requirements for the appropriate species.

3. **ENTRIES:** Entries close September 15, 2010. All fees and copy of registration papers must accompany entry form.

4. **REGISTRATION:** All llamas entered in the show MUST be registered with the International Llama Registry (ILR) or the Canadian Livestock Records Corporation (CLRC). Copy of registration papers must accompany entry form. The only exceptions are: nonbreeder llamas, llamas used only in youth classes and performance classes. All Alpacas must have ARI or CLRC registration papers except for juveniles due to the back up at their ARI they should have copies of their registration application.. All alpacas including juveniles entered in the show must be registered by The Alpaca Registry, Inc. (ARI) or Canadian Livestock Records Corporation (CLRC). Registration papers must be presented to show management for verification of name and age. Failure to meet this requirement prohibits entry in the show. All llamas must be entered in the exact name and registration number as shown on the registration certificate. Llamas recorded with ALSA for point accumulation must provide their ALSA number to show management. Entries in the Youth Division should be made in the name of the Youth Handler, not the llama. No changes after entries close.

5. **EXHIBITORS:** Exhibitors must be registered owners. Exhibitors may or may not be the handlers.

6. **BASE DATE:** Base date for computing the animals' ages is the beginning show date, October 16, 2010.

7. **OWNERSHIP:** All llamas must be owned by the exhibitor by September 1, 2009. The date of purchase shall be construed to be the date transfer is recorded with the record association. Animals owned in partnership must be entered in the proper classes in the name of the partnership.

8. **PARKING & PASSES:** All exhibitors must pick up complimentary passes at the new Livestock Credentials Office at the East Gate entrance to the Fairgrounds. Additional 3-day passes or vehicle passes may be purchased at that time.

Complimentary 3-day personal passes will be issued depending on number of entries. Additional passes must be purchased.

9. **STALLING:** Llamas will be housed in the Horse Barn #2. Bring your own extension cords, fans, water hoses, etc.

10. **FARM DISPLAYS** and stall decorations are encouraged.

WOOL DIVISIONS

Suri Wool: Fleece with luster that hangs and drapes over the llama's body, forming a natural part along the spine. Fibers are grouped into very distinctive and well defined lock structure, with the absence of crimp and loft.

Light Wool: Minimal body wool, short neck wool with smooth legs.

Medium Wool: Moderate to long body wool, minimal to moderate neck wool, smooth to moderate leg wool.

Heavy Wool: Abundant body and neck wool with minimal to abundant leg wool (i.e. leg wool at least to knee and hock)

Juvenile: 5 - 12 months - born Oct. 17, 2009 - May 17, 2010

Yearling: 13 - 24 months - born Oct. 17, 2008 - Oct. 17, 2009

2-Year-Old: 25 - 36 months - born Oct. 17, 2007 - Oct. 17, 2008

Adult: Over 36 - born on or before Oct. 16, 2007

ALPACAS

Juvenile: 6-12 months - born Oct. 17, 2009 - April 16, 2010

Yearling & Older: 13 months & older - born on or before Oct. 16, 2009

YOUTH

Junior Youth: Handler age 8 by show date thru 11 years of age.

Intermediate Youth: Handler age 12-14 years as of Jan. 1, 2010

Senior Youth: Handler age 15-18 years as of Jan. 1, 2010

SATURDAY, OCT. 16, 2010 - Performance Classes - 8:30 am

Animals may only show in ONE Performance Division (animals showing in Youth Division May NOT show in Open or Novice Division)

Performance classes are open to any llama or alpaca five months of age or older.

Novice classes are open to all llama or alpacas who have never entered in Advance class and/or who have earned no more than three ribbons in either first, second or third place in Open or Novice division in previous shows, in the respective classes. At the option of the exhibitor, after placing once in either first, second or third, the llama may enter Advanced division.

Advanced classes are open to all entries who have previously placed first, second or third place in Open or Novice division in that category at previous shows, or to any llama deemed capable of competing at the advanced level by its owner. Once a llama has entered an Advanced class it is no longer eligible to compete in Novice, regardless of placement. Llamas being shown in Youth classes by more than one youth, are not eligible to enter the Novice or Advanced classes at the same show, in that category.

Pack Classes: Alpacas now may be used in Pack Classes. Llamas or Alpacas must be at least 5 months of age to compete in Novice or Advanced pack classes. Llamas/Alpacas 5 to 36 months old must carry a pack system or training pack with two cinches, filled with lightweight material to simulate a full pack. Llamas/Alpacas 36 months or older must have a pack with two cinches and removable panniers and carry a minimum of 20 lbs.

Youth Pack Classes: The llama must be 12 months or older and carry a two cinch pack. Panniers do not have to be removable - up to 36 months, only lightweight material. Llamas over 36 months can carry up to 10 lbs in the intermediate class.

Youth Performance Champion: In order to qualify, youth must compete in Youth Obstacle, PR and Pack, and use the same animal for all three classes.

Geriatric Obstacle Class: This is a fun class open to handlers over 50 and Llamas over 12 years of age. There will be 10 obstacles suitable for the handlers and Llamas.
